Add an Appositive 2

An appositive is a word or phrase that identifies a noun or gives additional information about a noun. The appositive is usually next to the noun it is identifying or clarifying. It is usually, but not always, right before or after the noun.

In the sentence below, the appositive is underlined.

The judge, a man of great wisdom, sentenced the criminal to jail.

or

A man of great wisdom, the judge sentenced the criminal to jail.
